42. Correct Option C This can be found on page 27 of the novel where Openn Day is said to be dreaded by teachers because parents often came with "trailer-loads of complaints."

43. Correct Option B Mr Guta asked the MD to immediately sack Mr Fafore for the supposed "grammatical error" that Mr Fafore had taught his child. This can be found on page 27 of the novel.

44. Correct Option B The school no longer permitted students to copy notes from the class prefect because a parent once sued the school for this practice. The parent, an accountant with an oil company did not like how his daughter was exploited by the teachers as she was told to copy the notes on the board because she had good handwriting. He tries to get the director to understand that when a collective noun like "group" is used, it should be followed by a plural noun as in "Group of Schools". This can be found on page 34 of the novel.

51. Correct Option A The director claimed the ritual was necessary because it was actually part of a special prayer for his late father, who had given him the land on which the school was built. This can be found on page 41 of the novel.

64. Correct Option C Bepo developed a phobia for the renewal of his passport have heard tales of new rules, hassles applicants were experiencing and the non-availability of booklets. This can be found on page 48 of the novel.
65. Correct Option C Bepo developed a phobia for the renewal of his passport have heard tales of new rules, hassles applicants were experiencing and the non-availability of booklets. This can be found on page 48 of the novel.
66. Correct Option D This can be found on page 49 of the novel.

71. Correct Option D This can be found on page 55 of the novel.

72. Correct Option B While the drama class presented in front of Mr Bepo, they presented a Canoe dance of the Badagry people. This dance transported him back to Badagry where he had pictured the slaves and their agonies. This can be found on page 55 and 56 of the novel.

73. Correct Option C This can be found on page 58 of the novel.

74. Correct Option B Bepo was billed to jet out with Emirates Airlines at 10:00pm on Saturday. This can be found on page 59 of the novel.

75. Mr Ogunwale, Mr Bepo's landlord offered to drive him to the airport. This can be found on page 60 of the novel.

76. Correct Option A His wife had advised Mr Bepo to pack iru (locust beans) and egusi (melon seeds) ground with crayfish and she also requested that he buy dry snails. This can be found on page 60 of the novel.

77. Correct Option B The primary setting of the novel is Stardom Schools. This is where most of the events take place and it is also the source of Mr Bepo's conflict i.e. whether to keep working there as he has for more than two decades or to relocate abroad to join his wife and children.

78. Correct Option D Mr Adewale Adebbepo aka Bepo aka The Lekki Headmaster is the protagonist of the novel. It is around him that the events in the novel are centred.

82. Correct Option C Mr Audu, the Fina Arts teacher, is known for his well-timed witty remark. In chapter 1 of the novel, he refers to the MD as "a witch and a wizard rolled into one". He is also the one who coined the name "The Lekki Headmaster" for Mr Bepo.

Both students clashed in the Best Dancer category at the end-of-year party but Banky was crowned winner. This led Tosh's to threaten a lawsuit because they felt slighted. 88. Correct Option C Bepo had a nasty experience at the NIN office because the network glitches were terrible. This can be found on page 53 of the novel.

89. Correct Option C The Canoe dance is a dance of the Badagry people. The performance reminds him of his time at the Heritage Museum in Badagry and he is reminded of the brutal treatment of slaves by the white men. This makes him emotional. This can be found on page 55-56 of the novel.

90. Correct Option C This can be found on page 44 of the novel.

91. Correct Option B The "migration tales" in the novel show that migration is a mixed bag of blessings and challenges. While some enjoy the benefits of the countries they relocated to, others like Hope face the bad side of migration.

92. Correct Option C Mrs Ibidun Gloss, Stardom's school's MD, deeply respected and appreciated Bepo's contributions to the school. This is why she threw a greater send-off for him when he was relocating to the UK. She also gave him a \$10,000 cheque, the most she has ever gifted a staff who was being sent off.

93. Correct Option C Mr. Bepo's breakdown was due to internal conflict and pressure to leave Stardom Schools for the UK. This can be found on page 10 of the novel where the reason for his breakdown is finally revealed.

94. Correct Option B The boarding fee is N165,000 per session. This is a reduction from the original N250,000. This can be found on page 6 of the novel.

95. Correct Option D The boarding fee at Stardom school was reduced as a strategy to encourage punctuality among students. A lot of the students live very far away from school and so are not able to make it on time. The reduction of the boarding fees allowed a lot of parents to afford to enrol their students at the boarding houses. This can be found on page 6 of the novel.

96. Correct Option D The novel's central focus is the discussion of migration challenges and the crisis of identity. Bepo, as he prepares to relocate abroad, contemplates the different tales of those who migrated abroad. He also considered the impact this migration has on his identity. At the Heritage Museum in Badagry, he is reminded of the brutal history of slavery and feels that this voluntary migration to the lands of those who once colonised us is a form of 'new slavery'.

97. Correct Option B The novel portrays the "Japa" issue as a personal and moral dilemma. The protagonist's journey throughout the novel is a personal journey. He contemplates every step he has made in both his personal and professional life to see how far he has come and to determine whether or not it would be a good idea to relocate abroad. Bepo understands that, on the one hand, travelling abroad has its benefits, such as increased pay, access to better healthcare and being closer to his family. But, he also understands that leaving Nigeria would mean abandoning his students whom he had nurtured. This is the personal and moral dilemma that most Nigerians face when they try to decide whether or not to relocate abroad.

98. Correct Option C The central physical setting of the novel is Stardom Schools, Lagos. It is here that most of the events in the novel occur.

99. Correct Option B The setting that serves as a source of psychological conflict for Bepo is the Black Heritage Museum in Badagry. Here, he contemplates the brutal history of black slaves and begins to draw a parallel between this history and the contemporary voluntary migration of Nigerians to countries of those who once colonised us. This becomes a source of psychological conflict for Bepo.

100. Correct Option A The most common narrative technique used in the novel is flashback. The writer uses this technique to relate events that happened in the past to the readers.

101. Correct Option B This can be page 12 of the novel where it is revealed that Bepo, amongst other things, has thought of establishing his own school after having garnered a lot of experience in teaching and school management. His only fear was if he would have enough money to "float a standard school, given the taste he had already imbibed at Stardom." He had initially built a school - "Fruitful Future" but it had crumbled due to socio-economic challenges in the location.

102. Correct Option A Chief Ogba, Tosh's father, demanded that Banky and his parents write separate letters of apology to both him and his son. He also insisted that the letters be published in the school magazine. This was after Banky had

called Tosh "the son of an ex-convict" during his speech for the position of Social prefect. This can be found on page 43 of the novel.

103. Correct Option C Irony is a powerful tool in the novel, used to critique societal norms and highlight the contradictions in modern Nigerian life. Bepo reflects on the irony of Africans willingly migrating to the countries of their former colonial masters, describing this as a "new slavery." Stories like Jare's regret over leaving a banking job to care for the elderly in London highlight the unpredictability of these pursuits.

She believes that the staff could rebel and jointly establish their own school with the money and steal the school's band ideal. This can be found on page 26 of the novel.

108. Correct Option B Although Mr Fafore lives quite far away, he always prepares his day so that he arrives very early. He wakes up as early as 4:00 am and sets out for school at 4:30 am. He would get to the school premises around 6:00 am, rest his head on his desk and snooze for about an hour before his colleagues arrived. This can be found on page 30 of the novel.

109. Correct Option C Bepo believes that learning should focus on the growth and development of the students. He focuses on imparting the knowledge that the students need to be able to thrive when they get out into the world. He also believes that learning should be hands-on and engaging as he constantly encourages doing extra-curriculars that help students apply the knowledge they learnt in practical situations. This can be seen in the phone-making initiative that he had hoped to see to the end before he relocated to the UK. Finally, he believes that excursions can enhance the learning experience. He took the students out on excursions so that they can have a solid knowledge of the Nigerian environment before they travelled abroad to further their education. However, he does not believe in maintaining a strict authoritarian approach. He rather believes in resolving conflicts amicably.

110. Correct Option B Bepo chose to renew his passport in Ibadan because there were longer queues in Lagos and paying to expedite the process could cost up to N200,000 to N250,000. He heard that he could travel to neighbouring states like Ogun, Oyo, Osun and Kwara where there would be less crowd; and so he settled for Ibadan. This can be found on page 48 of the novel.

This negative campaigning led to a chain of events including the suspension of this process of democratic election. This can be found on page 42 of the novel.
